Winner of the Knock Out




Bruce Fletcher and Bert Waite played the final of the Knock Out on 30th July. Bruce won the match 2 up on the 18th.

We just cracked up. 😊😊😊😊😊😊😊😊😊😊


July Monthly Medal Dinner
