Golf Month October



All Members,

The Jubilee GC is going to take part in Golf Month October. This is a national campaign to encourage more people to get involved in the game. Refer the attached flyer that has further details.

Our club is going to hold an event on Sunday the 22nd of October.

What are we going to do?

- We will be conducting an ambrose event with between 2 and 4 people per team.
- We are encouraging current members to make up a team that can include family members, work colleagues and friends.
- Teams of 2 will be paired with other teams of 2 to make a playing group where required.
- Teams are to be made up of people that have never played golf or have very little experience.
- We especially want to encourage participation from children/juniors and ladies as these groups are currently underrepresented within our club

What is the format of the event?

- To ensure that everyone's interest is maintained, we will only play 6 holes. This will also mean that we do not have a major impact on time
- The focus is participation, therefore it will not be competition based
- Teams can keep their individual scores if they like, but there will be no focus on the results
- Rules will be modified
 - Players can tee the ball up
 - If the ball to be played is in a hazard, under trees, in a gully, out of bounds, near tree roots, pathways, rocks, etc, then simply move the ball to a playable location
 - Yellow markers are to be used
 - Teams may tee off on multiple start points, example 1st, 10th and 13th holes.
 - The following tees will utilize the ladies tee box to open up the fairways and shorten these holes, 5th, 6th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 15th and 18th.

Further information

- The event will be at no cost, no green fees, no competition fees
- Sausage sizzle to follow the golf
- All players to wear comfortable, flat soled runners/joggers if they do not have golf shoes
- Share golf clubs where possible, further sets maybe sourced upon request
- Muster at the course 9:30am for 10:00am start

The entire focus of the event is participation, fun, enjoyment and spending a couple of quality hours with family and friends. Please organize teams as soon as possible and place players names on the time sheet near the bar. To help make the day work, we require all names by Sunday 15th October. Please share with your family and friends and help make this a fun morning.
