

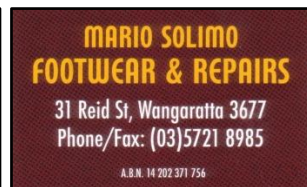
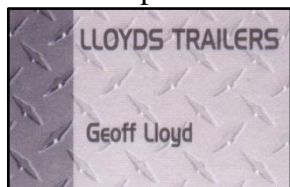

Bunker Etiquette

Another reminder: Please spread the word Please: Leave the bunker in a better condition than you find it.

JGC's main bunker issue

Please: Smooth but do not rake the wall of the bunker.

Please: Do not enter or leave via the wall of the bunker (kangaroo accepted).



The club Superintendent, Brian, has asked that you be reminded of bunker etiquette. If we end up in a bunker we all want the best chance of getting out in one shot.

- Enter and leave the bunker from the lowest edge.
- The pronged edge of the rake is for the base of the bunker only. The grooves should run towards the green.
- The flat edge of the rake is to smooth the walls of the bunker.
- Leave the rake in the bunker on the side furthest from the fairway and lined up towards the hole.
