



Service Victoria QR Codes ~ Compulsory ~

From the 28th of May, all golf clubs and facilities must utilise the State Government QR code check in service provided by Service Victoria for all attendees at your facility. For the avoidance of doubt, this includes staff, members, and visitors, for the purpose of attending work, playing golf, practising or using other facilities such as the clubhouse, and everyone must check in on each visit.

New Cart Shed

Greens Report

The 2nd and 13th greens have a lot of couch coming through, the only way to eliminate this is to poison and re-sow. This will be done in 3 sections: back third first then left third, then the right third; this will make it possible to continue using the green during the process.

Putting Green

The existing practice putting green will be levelled so that it is flat rather than with all the current undulations.
