

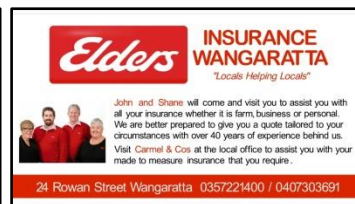

On December 13th we hosted 134 entries for the North East District Veterans Golf Association inaugural Christmas event. The day consisted of a 10.30 am shotgun start with 67 teams competing in a 2 person Ambrose event. After everyone was QR code in and double Vax certificates checked teams were organized and the event got underway on time.

The weather was 31 degrees with very slight breeze which over the course of 5 hours turned out to be a bit warm, however most enjoyed the relative comfort of our air conditioned club rooms and bar after the event.

The Vic Four-Ball Championship is open to all amateur golfers who have a valid Australian handicap.

Players can register as part of a men's, women's or mixed pair and compete in one (or multiple) of 21 qualifying rounds held across Victoria between January and March.

Winners at each venue will qualify for the 36-hole State Final at Moonah Links (Open Course) & Portsea Golf Club.

Prizes will be awarded at each qualifying venue for 1st, 2nd & 3rd in each section as well as NTPs.

GA H'Cap Limit: 36.4 (men), 45.4 (women)

The Qualifying round at Jubilee Golf Club is on Sunday, January 30th 2022.

Entry Fee: \$100 per pair or \$70 per pair (host club members)

Inclusions: Light lunch, 18-holes of golf and a chance at \$1,500 worth of prizes

Start Time: 9:00am Shotgun start

Entries Open: 9am Wednesday 3 November 2021

Entries Close: 12pm Thursday 20 January 2022
