Congratulations to the many club volunteers over the past 2 months in building our new outdoor deck area. This will be a wonderful place to celebrate or commiserate our round!

It is only fitting now to ensure that this is kept clean by members. The feeding of our native birds has become popular by some members, only to see them now expect it and to linger around the deck and verandah – dropping their calling cards everywhere - over chairs, tables, floor. Is another volunteer expected to scrub down all the tables and chairs for people to sit? I would suggest that if members wish to feed the birds (e.g., magpies) that it is done on the 5th, 11th, 16th etc. fairways, the one's far away from the club house.

Also please remember that our native birds can become sick if fed old seed or processed foods like bread. It is suggested fruit such as pear, apple, berries, figs, grapes; oats, other bird seed, peanuts in their shell, or perhaps the odd spider, frog, snails, worms, young rabbits, whatever you can fit into your pocket.

Snippets from "past minutes of meetings" that remind us of our club's history.

May 1935. A meeting of interested people was convened at the Wangaratta Town Hall where it was voted to form a golf club with a name to be decided at a later date. The course was to be situated in a paddock on property on the Moyhu Road owned by Mr Hoare and was to use the natural grass available as greens. Proposed rental amount for the golf season was 10 pounds. At the first AGM the name "Jubilee" was adopted. The name was suggested by Mrs Amy Fisher as 1935 was the Jubilee Year of King George V.

March 1936. As the JGC was unable to reach agreement with Mr Hoare a motion was made at the AGM that the links be relocated to Mr V. McDonald's property on Yarrawonga Road for 25 pound per year, and that the club would have sand greens. A vote was also taken to affiliate with the VGA and VLGA.

1937. Mr George Moore had the first Hole- in-One on the Jubilee Golf Course.

April 1938. A new clubhouse was erected for 120 pound.
