




This is the first report for 2023 as there has been little happening so far this year however it would appear that we may be returning to almost pre Covid conditions with over 30 attending for the last two weeks.

We have 44 members registered with North East District Veterans Golf Association. Twelve of those members went to Mansfield in January with our members taking out two nearest the pins and one sharing the teams' event. Congratulations to those members. We also have approx. thirty members booked in to go to Brighton on 27th February which will be our biggest number for some time. Good luck to all those going and I hope you do well. Whilst writing this I thought it may be a good time to bring up a couple of housekeeping issues with our normal Monday Vets. As most of you will know the Vets started as a group of members over 50 years of age who got together on Mondays for a social hit. As it started to grow with more attending, they starting running their own tournaments, and after golf had a drink and chat together. This got harder as laws changed regarding drink driving and recent history has seen an increasing number heading off to lunch together after golf. In order to get to the selected lunch site at a reasonable time we have been requested to try and complete our round in 4 hours or less. This is not unreasonable given that we mostly play in groups of 3. It is also a good time to remind everyone of the 3 minute rule when looking for a lost ball which always applies not just when there is a group behind you. So if we could all keep this in mind for the future. Additionally we remind everyone to put their score cards in before putting your gear away so that results can be calculated in a timely manner.

Another issue that has surfaced lately is members approaching our captain requesting not to be paired up with certain other people. Under normal circumstances the draw, apart from those playing together carts, is done on a blind basis with cards being shuffled and then put into groups of 3. In this manner usually you get to play with different people each week which should enhance the social aspect. Trying to assist with these requests puts added stress on the people doing the draw so we ask that you refrain from this in the future or we may lose those that put in the effort to run the event at the moment.

Let's keep the numbers attending climbing. As well as A & B grades we now pay a "C" grade when there are more than 30 players and if we get more than 40 that will increase to a "D" as well. Good luck and Good Golf and we look forward to seeing everyone each week
