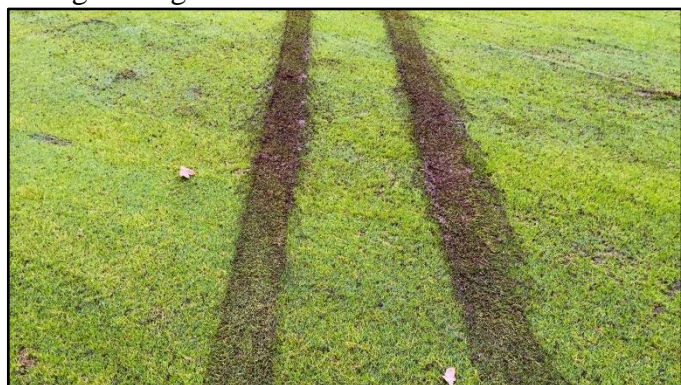

Wet conditions and cart traffic do not mix

Golf carts can improve access and generate revenue, but they can also have negative impacts on turf health and playing conditions. Some cart users are still driving through wet areas. If cart users do not do the right thing, carts could be off the course again. It is to your advantage to do the right thing.



Carts, can slide, skid and sink when turf is wet, causing immediate and lasting damage. Wet soils are also more vulnerable to compaction, which can have negative long-term effects on playing conditions, even if those impacts are not immediately visible. Avoiding wet areas and respecting cart usage instructions is an important part of being a responsible cart driver.

Guide to Golf Etiquette

Relief in the 'general area'

As part of the new golf rules, the USGA and R&A have declared a player can take free embedded-ball relief in any part of the course deemed the "general area." The "general area" is what was once called "through the green," which is the area of the golf course that isn't the tee box and putting green of the hole being played, hazards or bunkers.

The ball can be cleaned before relief is taken.

men who drop in every Thursday to volunteer around the course, raking bunkers, filling up sand buckets, mowing fairways which they all enjoy.

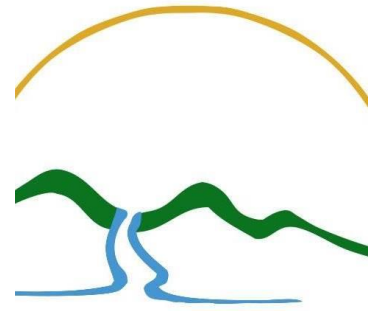
"We had one older member who was 90 involved and he said he would have died years ago if it wasn't for that.
