Guide to Golf Etiquette

Arrive early to tee off

It is up to you to put your name on the time sheet either online or through the Pro Shop. Equally, it is your responsibility to take your name off at the earliest opportunity if you cannot play. There are so many reasons that might unexpectedly mean you can't play, but there is really no excuse for not removing your name. A quick call to the Pro Shop will give other members the opportunity to play, particularly on Saturdays when the field is full. Aim to arrive 20 minutes before you are scheduled to tee off. Not only does this give you time to check in, get organised and hit some practice shots, it also means you're less likely to keep other people waiting and ensure everyone else can tee off on time too.
