A special thanks to Aaron Kungl for supporting the team at every game.

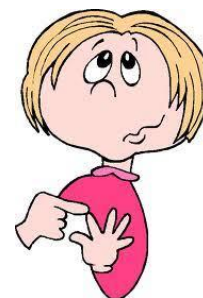

Guide to Golf Etiquette

Responsibility for Scoring

You are responsible for keeping the score of your playing partner, and they are responsible for keeping track of yours. It is recommended that you confer after every hole, some like to confirm the score when you are both on the green before putting begins. Either way, you are expected to be conscious of how many shots **you each have** on any hole. Don't just leave it up to them, or you could end up with an even worse result than you deserve. And conversely, they score better than they played.

Rule of the Month

Do I get a free drop from tree roots and embedded rocks?



The rules of golf are "Play it as it lies, or take a drop for a 1 stroke penalty." Luckily for us, our committee has adopted a local rule to prevent personal injury and/or golf club damage from natural rocks embedded in the ground (that cannot be moved away as Loose Impediment) and for tree roots. Either of these on the course may be treated as an ABNORMAL GROUND CONDITION.

Where a tree root or embedded rock interferes with the lie of the player's ball or the area of the player's intended swing, relief without penalty may be taken. This includes the chance a forward driven ball may deflect dangerously off the tree root.

So, at Jubilee, the ball may be lifted and dropped within one club-length of, and not nearer to the hole, the nearest point of relief.

Note: Relief under this Rule is not available for interference to the player's stance.

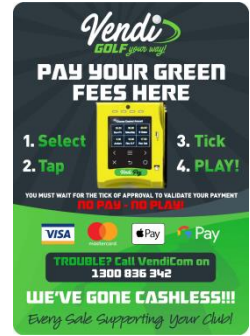

Everyone was very complimentary of the lunch and high tea provided. Well done catering volunteers.



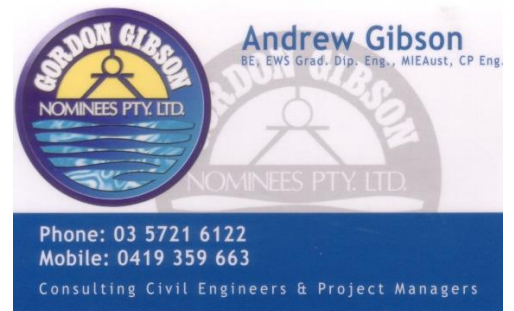
