## Around the Course

Our course is in magnificent condition for this time of year, our staff and volunteers are putting in the hard work to keep it that way so here are a few tips for us to remember. Divot repairs, don't be afraid to fill in someone else's as well as your own if the need arises. Pitch marks on greens: If pitch marks are repaired as soon as they happen they repair much faster than if it's done by someone else the next day.

eg. *Insert the pitch repairer into the turf at the edge of the depression and with a gentle twisting motion push the edges towards the centre, tap lightly on the surface with your putter or foot to level the area, if done correctly it is almost invisible.*

**Please remember that greens staff have right of way at all times, it is a massive task to mow a golf course of over 6km in length plus tees, greens and rough areas several times a week, if they have to stop what they are doing too often it takes even longer.**

## Rule of the Month

Rule 13 - PUTTING GREENS

- \* A ball is on the putting green when any part of the ball touches the putting service.
- \* The ball can then be marked, lifted and cleaned and replaced in it's original position.
- \* Sand and loose soil and loose impediments on the green may be removed without penalty.
- \* Damage on the putting green may be repaired by the player without penalty by using hand, foot or ball mark repair tool or tee etc.
- \* Damage does not include conditions that are a result from natural forces eg rain, weeds, disease or uneven growth or natural wear of the hole.
